

2025 WISE in Suwa-Shiojiri, May 30-June 1, 2025

Japan Institute for Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship (JSIE) organized Women's Initiative for Sustainable Empowerment (WISE) in Shimosuwa on May 30 – June 1, 2025 at Fushimiyatei. Supported by Shimosuwa-cho, this program is designed to promote entrepreneurship and collaboration toward innovative solutions against various social challenges related to Sustainable Developmental Goals (SDGs). We welcomed 27 participants from various countries, including Kenya, the Philippines, Russia, Botswana, India, Egypt, United States, Canada, and Japan. They had opportunities to shape ideas into plans through group work and to learn leadership and communication skills.

Under the theme of “Global x Inclusive x Leadership ~ Creating New Social Values for Sustainable Community,” 2025 WISE in Suwa-Shiojiri was supported by Honjin Iwanami Family, Shimosuwa-cho, Globalgiving, K.K. nabe, Persuade inc., and K.K. JSIE invited innovative ideas aimed at making society better for the next generation. Participants pitched their solutions to pressing social issues on the first day, followed by a vote to select the top five ideas. Based on shared interests, five cross-border groups were formed to bring those ideas to life. Over the three-day program, group members collaborated intensively to develop their proposals. The WISE program is proudly supported by the Honjin Iwanami family, and we were honored to host a special talk session with the 28th-generation head of the Iwanami family in a beautiful Japanese garden setting.

JSIE supports fostering global talent and offers global networking opportunities for participants, including students, young and experienced professionals, with an emphasis on helping women and younger generations realize their greatest potential. The WISE program is to provide opportunities to shape our life mission and work toward social challenges.

JSIE particularly focused on the following points and asked participants to consider such principles.

- *Identify and define problem(s)
- *Present and explain your ideas to others
- *Negotiate, collaborate, and involve with others
- *Accept different values and be flexible
- *Play leadership and bring “the best outcome”

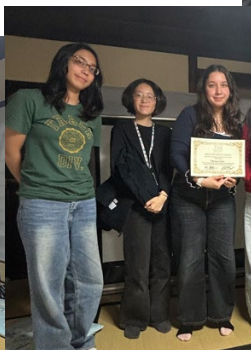

Mentors played a vital role by offering diverse perspectives, posing critical questions, and encouraging participants to continue refining their plans. Ms. Shuri Fukunaga, a top PR strategist and CEO of Persuade Inc., provided insights into business risk management. Ms. Mari Kogiso shared the viewpoint of a social impact fund investor, drawing on her extensive experience with social enterprises. Mr. Michal Brown, co-founder of K.K. nabe, emphasized the importance of practicality and designing from the user’s perspective. Mr. Daniel Cohn, a health expert and CEO of Vitric Advisors, stressed sustainability and strategies for achieving meaningful impact. In addition, Caitlin Puzzar, a 2019 WISE Fellow and CEO of K.K. Guardian, introduced her SOS communication Support tool designed to detect child abuse and bullying. By learning from the mentors’ journeys, participants gained valuable insights to guide the development of their own projects.

At the end of the three-day program, five teams presented their project ideas and implementation plans. Each group delivered a brilliant pitch, showcasing unique ideas shaped by their experience working in a highly diverse environment. Participants enjoyed rich & meaningful communication throughout the program. They worked tirelessly to develop sustainable mechanisms and had thoughtful discussions around the how, why, what, and when of launching new projects. The organizers are extremely proud of the high-quality project plans each team produced in such a short time.



The **Digital Innovation Award** was presented to the *Mamorikko* team for their anonymous consultation app designed to support children who experience sexual abuse. The **Best Storytelling Award** went to the *Rise a Nanny* team, which proposed a community-based ecosystem in Kenya to train and support nannies through micro-financing, aiming to improve both quality and sustainability. The **Investable Award** was given to *Heritage Beyond Generations*, a team that introduced a model for sharing the traditional tea ceremony learning path to engage younger generations. The **Best Synergy Award** went to *Minna no Ie*, a project aimed at raising awareness and addressing the shortage of foster parents in Japan. The **Nagano Special Award** was presented to the *Renew* team, which tackled the issue of population decline by proposing strategies to attract young migrant families to the region. JSIE would also like to extend heartfelt thanks to the senior helpers of Fushimiyatei for hosting the WISE program, and to *Nagano Nippo* for their valuable coverage of the event.

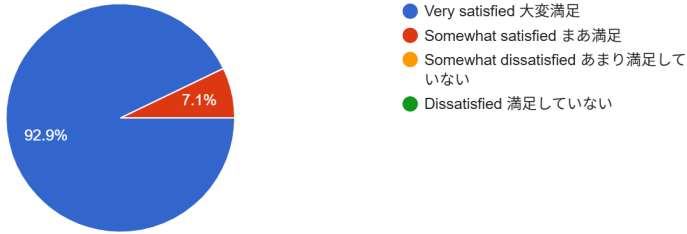

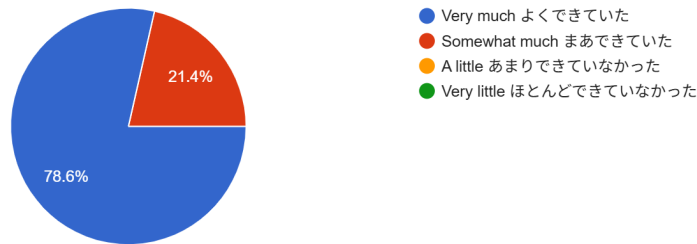
